Facts About Lambda Chi Alpha Reveal It Is 'Tops' Financially Of All Fraternities

Lambda Chi Alpha was re-cently voted strongest among the national fraternities financially The membership list of the fraternity shows 29,-000 living members Sigma Chapter (Ann Arbor) was the eighth Zeta of Lambda Chi Alpha to be founded and was the first chapter of the fraternity in the West Lambda Chi Alpha has been among the first four of the national fraternities in scholarship for the past twelve years The fraternity has undergraduate chapters (active) on 106 campuses-located in 40 states and in Canada Theta Kappa Nu at the time of the Union (Sept. 1939) had 37 chapters . . . Nine T. K. N. chapters were on campuses where L. C. A. had active chapters The union gave Lambda Chi Alpha 28 new (non-duplicating) chapters Lambda Chi Alpha had 78 undergraduate units at the time of the merger Only five other national Greek-

letter societies besides Lambda Chi Alpha own their headquarter's office Lambda Chi Alpha's secret magazine, Delta Pi, is now called the Inescutcheon in deference to T. K. N., the name of that organization's private magazine having been the Inescutcheon The T. K. N. initiation ritual has been condensed to form a new Lambda Chi Alpha pledge ritual The fraternity's pledge pin design has been altered with a silhouette of the T. K. N. official badge placed as a background behind the Gothic arch of Lambda Chi Alpha. Vir Quisque Vir Est (Latin) (Every Man A Man), the former open motto of T. K. N. has been added to the Lambda Chi Alpha coat - of - arms, replacing Chale pa ta kala (Greek) The former T. K. N. motto is now on the streamer at the bottom of the coat-of-arms T. K. N.'s flower, the white rose, has become Lambda Chi Alpha's emblem from the floral kingdom.
